FOREIGN EXCHANGE STUDENT ADMISSION POLICIES

Salisbury Christian School is pleased to welcome foreign exchange students. Our foreign exchange program is available to incoming 10th and 11th grade students who meet the criteria listed here. If the student comes to SCS through a foreign exchange agency, the student will be expected to remain with that agency throughout his/her stay at SCS. In any given school year, SCS will admit no more than two students from any one agency.

Salisbury Christian School admits students of any race, color, sex, and national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school and in the administration of its educational policies, admission policies, and school-administered programs. Salisbury Christian does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, sex and national and ethnic origin in the recruitment of faculty and staff.

Attendance at SCS is a privilege and not a right. Each student should value positive attitudes toward spiritual things and the school. Additionally, each student should recognize the positive culture of the school as important for his/her own personal welfare as well as the welfare of classmates... "Live peaceably with all men." Romans 12:18. Students are asked to seek a spirit of humility, teachability, obedience, self-discipline, kindness and love.

Since specialists are needed to properly minister to children with special needs and since SCS is unable to provide programs for them, we are unable to accept students who: a) have severe physical handicaps, b) have severe learning or social difficulties, c) are emotionally disturbed and/or d) have a history of unruly or disruptive behavior.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

Salisbury Christian School desires to be a professional educational resource for Christian families in this region. Therefore, the following admission requirements have been established:

- Either the student or one parent has a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as evidenced through a written testimony.
- Willingness and desire to follow Jesus.
- Willingness and desire by student to attend SCS.
- Completed application forms, signed by parent(s), including shot record, birth certificate, references and registration/testing fees.
- Satisfactory scholastic and behavioral records from previous school.
- Meeting of the host parents with the Upper School principal.
- Proficiency in the understanding and usage of the English language (SCS does not offer ESOL instruction). Testing may be necessary to determine proficiency. ***If the testing shows that the student is not at least at an intermediate level of proficiency, the student will be asked to withdraw.***

ENROLLMENT PROCEDURE / CHECKLIST

STEP ONE – INITIAL APPLICATION

The following completed items should be forwarded to the registrar's office:

1. Home Family Application and Host Family Application
2. Student Application
3. Application Fee of \$150 per family and Testing Fee of \$25 per child
4. Written testimony from the student or one parent briefly sharing how he/she came to know the Lord as his/her personal savior
5. Immunization Record Copy of Birth Certificate
6. Copy of current transcript
7. If the student has any special learning issues/needs, please provide a copy of all reports and testing
8. Copy of current passport

STEP TWO – REFERENCES

The following reference forms should be returned to us by the individuals who have completed them:

1. Personal Reference Forms (2) – One should be completed by a friend of the host family and one by a friend of the home family
2. School Reference Form – to be completed by a teacher your child has had recently
3. Church Reference Forms (2) – One should be completed by the pastor/priest of the host family's church and one by the pastor/priest of the home family's church

STEP THREE – TESTING

It may be necessary to ask the student to take an English proficiency test. This would be done via correspondence prior to their coming to the United States. Further testing may be necessary after they have started school.

STEP FOUR – ACADEMIC RECORDS REVIEW

The high school guidance counselor and/or school administrator will review the student's academic records.

STEP FIVE – MEETING AND ACCEPTANCE

The final application step is a meeting between the host family and the principal of the upper school. The purpose of the meeting is to further familiarize the host family with Salisbury Christian School, to discuss the meaning of Christian education and to finalize the placement of the student at SCS. After this meeting, both the host family and home family will receive notification of the acceptance of the student to SCS by the registrar either in writing or by a phone call.

STEP SIX – I-20 FORM

After the student has been accepted, SCS will provide the I-20 form needed for the student to obtain their F-1 student visa.

STEP SEVEN – PAYMENT

After the student has been accepted to SCS, payment of all tuition and fees is required. Payment may be in the form of a local check from the host family or a wire transfer from the home family. If the student does not come to SCS, the tuition amount paid will be refunded. Salisbury Christian School will not refund the \$150 registration fee or the \$25 testing fee.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

APPLICATION AND TESTING FEES

An application fee of \$150 per family and a testing fee of \$25 per student are due at the time your application is submitted to SCS. These fees are non-refundable.

TUITION: 2006-07 \$5,499

After the student has been accepted to SCS, payment of all tuition and fees is required. Payment may be in the form of a local check from the host family, a wire transfer from the home family or credit card. If the student does not come to SCS, the tuition amount paid will be refunded. There will be a \$25 charge for returned checks.

ATHLETIC FEE

An athletic fee will be charged to your account for each student in your family that participates in extra-curricular athletics. The fee is \$50 per student per sport for varsity teams; \$30 per student per sport for junior varsity teams.

EXTENDED CARE

After school supervision is available until 5:30 pm each school day. The cost per day is \$5.50 if the student is registered in advance; the cost is \$7.50 per day if not registered in advance.

TRANSFERRING FROM ANOTHER PRIVATE SCHOOL

If your child is coming to SCS from another private school, SCS may call the previous school to check your payment history. If you have outstanding debt at that school, SCS will place your application on hold until that debt is fully paid.

PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION

Christian Education

The purpose of education is to impart knowledge in order to prepare students for life. The primary responsibility for the education of the child lies with the parents. The interaction of the parents, church, and school forges values and practices that can last throughout the child's life. The Christian school partners with the parent in establishing an orderly and structured setting for learning to take place. Christian education seeks to encourage the students to view the acquisition of knowledge within a worldview that is consistent with the home and church experience of the student.

*In support of the role of the parents and church, there are three unique components of Christian school education:
the student, the teacher, and the curriculum:*

The Student

Humans are created in the image of God and therefore each student possesses incredible worth and potential. As such, each student must be viewed as an individual with unique intellectual, social, and physical capabilities. The student must be an active participant in the educational process for learning to be maximized.

The Teacher

The teacher must first have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and exhibit a passion for the education of children. The teacher must possess a mastery of his subject area and its biblical integration. It is imperative that the teacher knows his students and provides a dynamic and interactive learning environment. In addition to providing academic training, the teacher must also nurture, guide, and promote spiritual growth within the student.

The Curriculum

The curriculum must reflect the knowledge of God as well as the theme of the redemption and restoration of man. A Christian curriculum permeates all subject areas. The curriculum must be based upon an excellent academic foundation in which all subject areas are intentionally taught from a Christian worldview.
