SUMMER 2021 OVERVIEW

For students who have just completed Kindergarten and First Grade

The development of early literacy skills is one of the most important factors in a child's academic success! The Summer Reading Workshop is designed to provide additional instruction, support, and enrichment for students who have just completed Kindergarten and First Grade during the 2020-2021 school year. Students do not need to be below grade level to participate. The workshop gives students an opportunity for small group, differentiated instruction focusing on letter sounds, sight words, phonics, fluency, vocabulary development, writing, and comprehension. Fun, engaging lessons are designed to keep students' skills sharp while also creating a relaxed, hands-on summer experience!

Program Dates & Times:

- Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays in the month of July; 9:00 - 11:00 am

Cost:

- \$175 for the entire program

Registration & Payment Procedures:

- Step 1: Complete the online registration form.
- Step 2: Print and complete the Summer Reading Workshop Enrollment Confirmation Form and return it, with accompanying check, permission to draft, or confirmation of credit card payment, to the Program Coordinator, Mrs. Tabby Bova. Registration is not guaranteed until this form and payment are received. Payment is nonrefundable.

Note: The program is subject to both a minimum and maximum enrollment. Early registration is encouraged. If the program is canceled due to low enrollment, a full refund will be issued.

Deadline:

Registration and payment are due by May 21, 2021 to allow proper time for preparation. Should all available spots become filled, a waiting list will be established. If the program is canceled due to low enrollment, notification will be made by Friday, May 28, 2021.

Program Procedures:

Students can be dropped off at 9:00 am at the exterior classroom door of Room 141 (the door is labeled with the room number along the front of the Nehemiah Center). Students will be provided with a mid-morning snack. Students can be picked up from the same exterior classroom door at 11:00 am.

Conduct and Discipline Policy:
